

# Online Application Process

All students are to complete the online applications located at: [www.baypath.net](http://www.baypath.net)

Applicants must have a parent/guardian signature for the application to be verified and sent to the 8<sup>th</sup> grade counselor. *If there is no signature, the application stays at started and will not be moved along in the admissions process.*

Students must include parent/guardian information, including parent email. Student school email addresses will not be accepted in the online program (no notifications will be received via email as the system rejects student school emails).

Once applications are signed, BP staff will verify the applications. Once verified, middle/junior high counselors will have students in respective portals.

Once verified, middle/junior high school counselors will be able to complete the following for each student in each student's account:

- Provide 8<sup>th</sup> grade counselor recommendation/comments as appropriate
- Upload 7<sup>th</sup> grade and 8<sup>th</sup> grade (Q1) report cards
- Upload 7<sup>th</sup> grade and 8<sup>th</sup> grade (Q1) attendance (UNEXCUSED ONLY)
- Upload 7<sup>th</sup> grade and 8<sup>th</sup> grade (Q1) discipline record

Students will attend BP Interviews during scheduled day/times. Students must complete the interview in order to be considered for enrollment.

Students will be *conditionally accepted\** into Bay Path at the end of February. At this time, all students and families will be asked to complete the Voluntary Information section of the application and ensure they have completed the exploratory career choices section in its entirety. (All 22 programs must be listed on the right hand-side)

Students not accepted, will be placed on a wait list by score. Students will be notified via letter and/or email. The wait list will be compiled by the end of March.

**\*Conditional Acceptance:** Students must PASS English, Science, and Math in 8<sup>th</sup> grade to be enrolled at Bay Path for 9<sup>th</sup> grade. If a student fails one or more of the core classes, he/she will not be allowed to attend Bay Path unless he/she attends summer school in their sending town (or another town that offers 8<sup>th</sup> grade programming).
